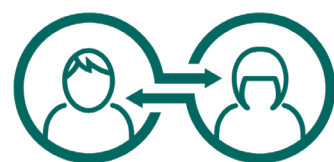

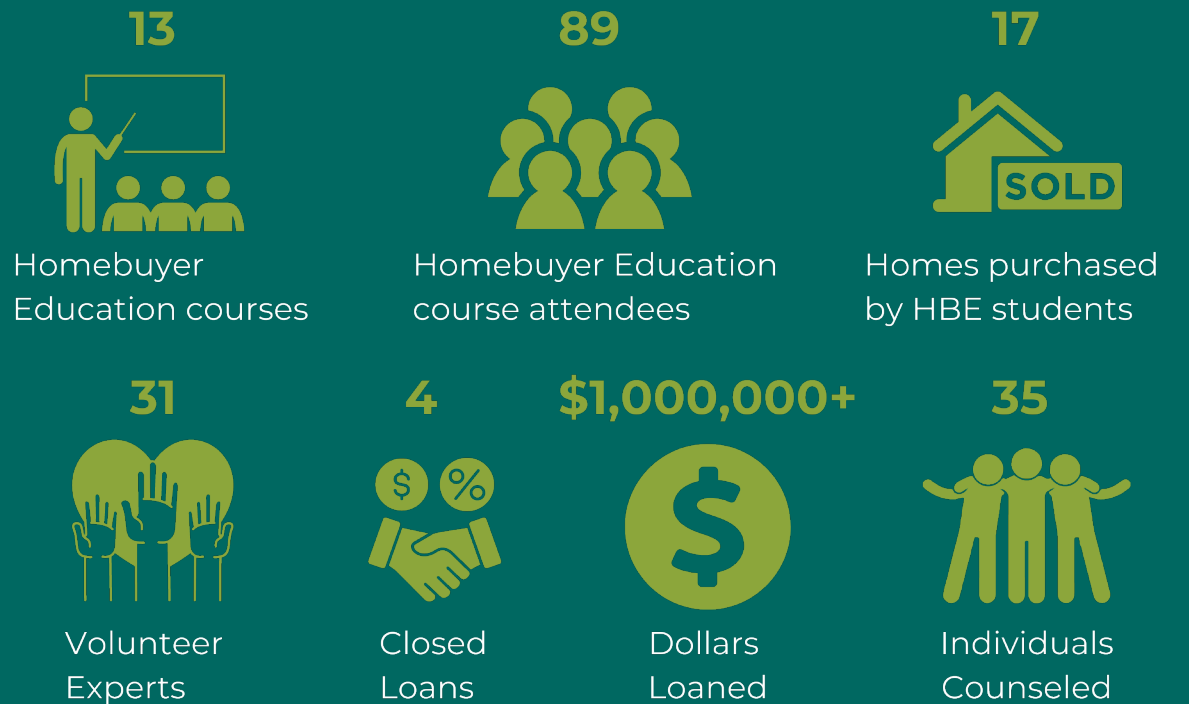

2023 YEAR IN REVIEW



THE HOMEOWNERSHIP CENTER

More than a Home

In June of 2021, the Kuper family found out they were being evicted from their apartment. In July, April found a lump in her breast, which turned out to be breast cancer. As the family navigated housing insecurity and chemo treatments, they rallied together to keep hope. They began living in a hotel and the parents were forced to be separated from their younger children. As a mom who had always had her kids close to her, that was very painful for April—especially as she was facing her health challenges.

April shared with the group, **“even though things were tough, I’m not going to let them give up. I know things are tough, but there eventually is a light at the end of the tunnel. Keep moving**

forward, right?”

This mantra led April and Christopher to NeighborWorks® Boise (NWB) in 2021. They enrolled in our free Pre- Purchase Coaching program with HUD-certified Housing Counselors. Through two years of individual coaching and Homebuyer Education at NWB—and lots of work on their part—they made significant progress on their financial and homeownership goals.

On March 15, 2023 the light at the end of the tunnel became a reality when, by surprise, the Kuper family found out they had been chosen for a 2023 First Story home. Partners gathered at NWB for this exciting reveal

including First Story and Hayden Homes staff and Mayor Jarom Wagoner of Caldwell. The homeowners received a zero-down, zero-interest 30-year home loan for a brand-new house in Caldwell build by Hayden Homes.

“We provide support to people actively working to change the trajectory of their lives,” said Annie Green, Director of the Homeownership Center at NeighborWorks® Boise. **“Families start their homeownership journey with us by completing a Homebuyer Education Course and Pre-Purchase Coaching.”**

Christopher Kuper was asked to share what owning a home means to him. His words really do hit home.

“I believe my wife said it best when she said, ‘homeownership means everything to us.’ We’ve been chasing the dream of homeownership, but it is always just out of reach for us. It was at the tip of our fingertips but then it would be yanked away

from us once again by some issue or another. We’ve been slaves to the whims of landlords and paid whatever exorbitant rents they have asked for. Trust me, for all the hours that I work (I work 60 hours a week), we’ve gotten really good at barely getting by. We’ve been given an amazing opportunity by NWB, First Story, Hayden Homes, and so many people and we’re very grateful. My wife and I will now have a legacy to one day to pass down to our children and eventually our grandchildren.”

We are so excited for this deserving family to begin building memories and their legacy in their new home.

HOMESHARE HUB™

Sharing Space, Creating Home

NeighborWorks® Boise launched its newest housing solution for the Treasure Valley.

Since 1986, Diane and Gary have shared their home with dozens of people. David is one of their current homesharers. Diane and Gary began sharing their home shortly after purchasing it, with the hopes of providing an affordable housing option for renters and speeding up paying off their mortgage.

“Over years of homesharing, we’ve met dozens of interesting people, many of whom remain our friends today.

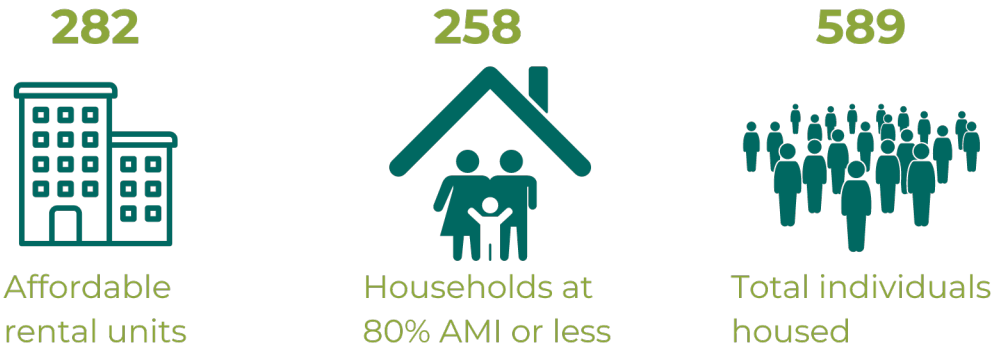
Among them are a Chinese geology research scientist (now back home in Beijing), a paraplegic who showed us what independence means, and a man who planted our fruit orchard while living

here and now tends it as a contractor.

We’ve improved our communication skills, our understanding of human nature and our bank account, all at the same time.” -Diane Ronayne, Home Provider

Diane and Gary currently share their home with David and with two brothers from Iraq. Diane and David enjoy regular games of Scrabble, and sometimes he joins the couple for dinner. The brothers, Sahib and Kahrman, are busy with school and work. Homesharing is gaining popularity nationwide as a smart way to increase affordable housing. NWB is confident the HomeShare Hub™ will be a welcomed housing solution in the Treasure Valley.

Building Accessibility

Cole Bluff Cottages, NWB's newest Pocket Neighborhood™, is a visitable subdivision. Visitable construction includes a few features that make homes easier for mobility-impaired people to live in and visit. At Cole Bluff Cottages, there are no steps going into the home. Once inside the home, all the doors are widened for better access. In addition, the plumbing is lifted for wheelchair accessibility and upgrades for ADA appliances are provided.

Making a home and subdivision visitable is important and provides more personal inclusion and housing choices for people with disabilities.

MERIDIAN HOME REPAIR

Repairing Homes, Bringing Hope

Chris is on disability and had to retire prematurely due to health challenges. As someone who used to maintain his home, it has been hard adjusting to limited physical activity. A couple of years ago, his kidneys began to fail, and he was put on dialysis. His medical bills accumulated to \$3,000,000 in 2022. The balance remaining after insurance wiped out his retirement. Chris lives alone and relies on the help of his neighbors and cousin. It was evident his 26-year-old home needed a new roof. Chris was under a great deal of stress worrying about future leaks, knowing there was no way he could afford the repairs.

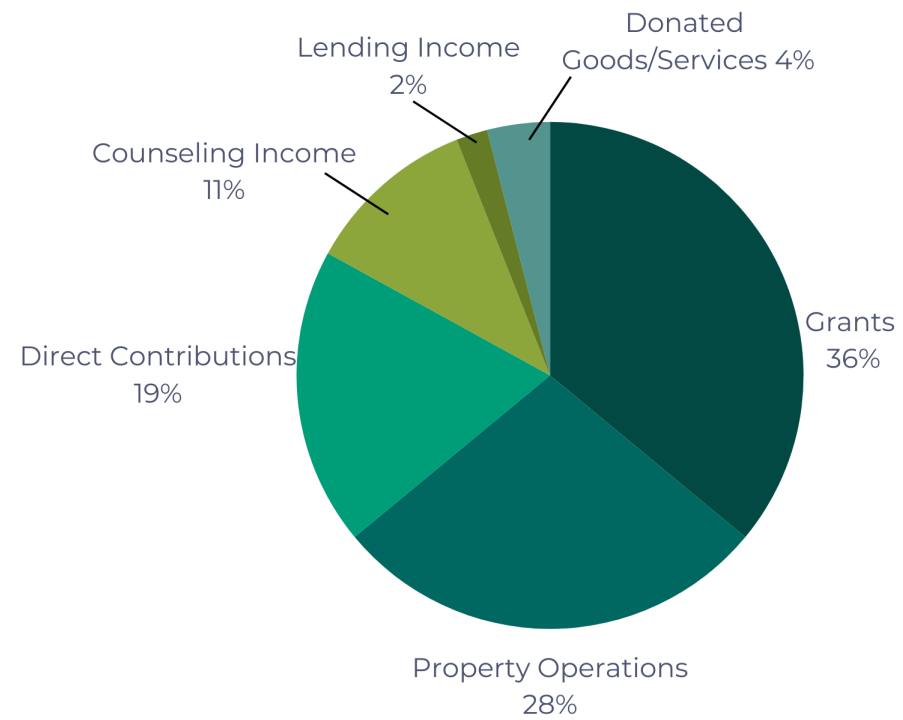
Out of options, his cousin told him about the Meridian Homeowner Repair Program. Chris applied, qualified for a grant, and NeighborWorks® Boise's Rehab/Asset Manager started the process of checking for any safety related issues within his home.

In addition to a faulty roof, inspections revealed that Chris's heater had a crack in the heating element, which could easily lead to a carbon monoxide leak. **"It was critical to my health they found that leak,"** Chris shared. Chris's home got a new roof, new furnace, carbon monoxide detectors, and some repainting. These repairs will help Chris remain in his home safely.

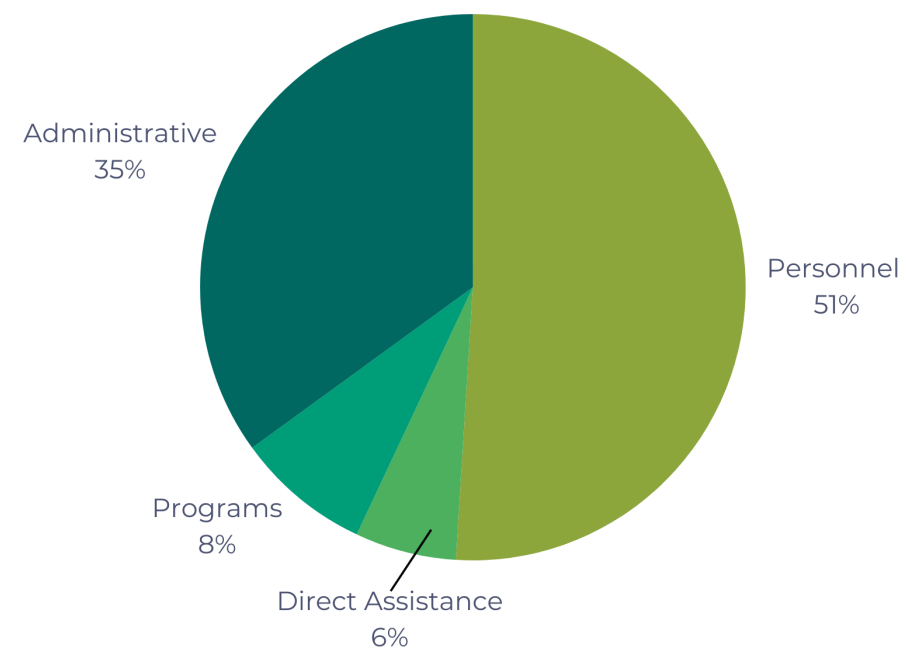
"I don't know what I would have done without this program," Chris stated. **"For me, it's like winning the lottery. This is a really important and helpful program."**
